The Wise Little Hen	DATE - June 9, 1934
	DIRECTOR - Wilfred Jackson
	SUMMARY - The title character needs help to plant corn for herself and her chicks. But Donald Duck and Peter Pig are totally unwilling to help.
	BEHIND THE SHORTS - Donald Duck's first screen appearance. Peter Pig (the "fifth Beatle" of Toondom) was never heard from again. This short can also be found on the <i>The Chronological Donald Volume 1</i> .

	SECTION - Favorite Characters
Three Little Pigs	DATE - May 27, 1933
	DIRECTOR - Bert Gillett
	SUMMARY - Three pigs head off to set up housekeeping, learning to deal with life and wolves.
	BEHIND THE SHORTS - An allegory for the Great Depression, this short won the Oscar, launched Disney's first song hit "Who's Afraid of the Big Bad Wolf," and became one of the longest running cartoons of all time.
	UNCENSORED - There were four edited versions of the <i>Three Little Pigs</i> . These included (1) the original uncensored short, (2) the short censored with the animation changed regarding the Big Bad Wolf's Jewish caricature mask, (3) the short censored with the original animation intact but the Big Bad Wolf's dialogue changed from a Jewish to non-Jewish tone, and (4) the short censored with both the animation changed and the soundtrack changed. This final version is featured on the DVD.

	LEONARD'S PICKS - Leonard Maltin discusses the stereotyped Jewish peddler disguise; includes footage of the wolf as he originally appeared.

	SUMMARY - The wolf returns, this time hungry for Little Red Riding Hood.
	BEHIND THE SHORTS - Despite Walt's claims of "you can't top pigs with pigs," this was the first of three sequels to <i>Three Little Pigs</i> .

	SUMMARY - The Big Bad Wolf enlists his three sons in the hunt for the Three Little Pigs.
	BEHIND THE SHORTS - Don't miss the German-sung menu of porcine delights.

	DATE - August 22, 1936
	DIRECTOR - Wilfred Jackson
	SUMMARY - Toby and Max Hare are back, this time battling it out in the boxing ring.
	BEHIND THE SHORTS - A slew of Silly Symphony alumni cameo as audience members at the match, including Elmer Elephant, Dirty Bill, and Jenny Wren, who coos, "I like a man who takes his time," to our slow-paced hero.
