	DIRECTOR - Walt Disney
	SUMMARY - The bones of the dead rise from their graves for a midnight jamboree.
	BEHIND THE SHORTS - The very first Silly Symphony, with animation by Ub Iwerks and music by Carl Stalling. The release date of August 22, 1929, reflects the date currently acknowledged by the The Walt Disney Company. Other sources, including some official Walt Disney Studios archival documentation, suggest May 10, 1929, as an alternate (and possibly more accurate) release date.

	BEHIND THE SHORTS - Features Hollywood caricatures, including Lionel Barrymore.
	UNCENSORED - Highlights black stereotypes in doorman and band member roles, along with numerous bugs smoking.

	DIRECTOR - Jack Cutting
	SUMMARY - The animal inhabitants of a farm come to musical life, most notably an amorous rooster and his pretty hen.
	BEHIND THE SHORTS - Many famous classical themes, such as Listz's "Hungarian Rhapsody," can be heard in this animal opera. Also, Cutting's directorial debut. You may recognize the duck's voice.
